The PADI SCUBA Diver introduces you to to the adventurous diving lifestyle, while still diving with PADI professionals in shallower depths. Start your scuba certification today!

What You Learn

The PADI SCUBA course consists of three main phases:

- Knowledge Development to understand basic principles of scuba diving
- Confined Water (pool) dives to learn basic scuba skills
- Open Water (sea) dives to review your skills and explore!

If you've tried diving through a Discover Scuba Diving experience or resort course, the skills you learned may be credited towards a portion of the full PADI SCUBA Diver course certification.



Prerequisites

To enrol in the course you must be 10 years or older.

The Fun Part

The fun part about this course is . . . well, just about all of it because learning to dive is incredible. You breathe underwater for the first time (something you'll never forget) and learn what you need to know to become a certified diver. During the course, you'll make at least three pool dives and two dives at local dive sites under the supervision of your PADI Instructor.



The Scuba Gear You Use

In the PADI Open Water Diver course, you learn to use basic scuba gear including a dive computer, and standard accessories. The equipment you wear varies somewhat, depending upon whether you're diving in tropical, temperate or cold water.

The Learning Materials You Need

PADI's Open Water Diver materials cover what you need to know about basic scuba diving skills, terminology and safety procedures. For each concept you'll read a description and watch a video demonstration. Then you'll jump in the pool to practice these skills with your instructor. Later, if you want to continue on to the full PADI Open Water Course, you use the same course materials as a reference guide, for future diving adventures, and to review what you learned.



What's included...

Your course fees include all your equipment hire, all boat fees to dive sites, refreshments on board, air fills, transport to and from pool training dives & of course your certification fees!

We recommend you purchase mask, snorkel, boots & fins as these items tend to provide more comfort when fitted to your personal needs. We offer 10% on all equipment sales for students throughout the duration of the course.



Cost:

The SCUBA Diver course costs £250. Here's what you get for your money:

We require a minimum deposit of £50 - This covers your theory manual and log book which you will need to record your training dives, and all your diving thereafter.

Upon completing your SCUBA diving course you are able to dive to 12 meters with a PADI professional around the world. This enables you to experience the amazing aquatic world while still remaining in your comfort zone and with the continued support of an experienced and qualified diver.

Your next step is to continue on to Open Water – and you've already done most of the work! You already have the course manual, so you can read that in your leisure and when you are ready, you only have two more pool segments, knowledge reviews and exam, and two final sea dives to complete! The PADI Open Water course will allow you to dive up to 18m with a buddy, and is the most widely recognised diving certification in the world! See you down there!
